### SCHOOL ROTATION SCHEDULE: March 29-April 1 (school festival)

Buses arrive at designated times: Specific *School schedule TBA*

- School bus arrives at the SCA
  - Kids have 5 minutes to drop coats off along railing by garage doors
  - Kids should be immediately guided into the Gallery and asked to be seated on the floor
  - 5 minute Welcome by SCA Executive Director Kristin Armstrong – she then introduces to Exhibit Docent
  - Exhibit Docent begins 15 minute exhibit talk followed by Q and A, and will take a couple minutes to describe the art project that the kids will work together to create. (A sample will be displayed on an easel in the gallery).
  - Group Volunteers will then divide kids into 25 or less students and escort them into the following rooms...
    - Group 1 = Computer Room
    - Group 2 = Art Room
    - Group 3 = Performance Studio
    - Group 4 = Gallery (If needed)
  - In the break out rooms – Head group volunteer will get the kids started on the art project - 25 minutes to complete
  - Beginning with Group 1 in Computer room, Food Docent will introduce the snack and release that group into the Lobby. Docent will proceed to Group 2 in the art room, then 3 and then 4 -release groups one at a time into Lobby
  - Food Volunteers will begin serving snacks in the lobby as each groups finishes their snack, they should be directed by SCA Staff to begin seating kids in theatre by groups
  - Kristin will introduce the performers in main theatre
  - 45 minute Martial Arts performance (Aikido demonstration)
  - Dismiss students thru Lobby (They should be able at that time see their group Art project in the Lobby on easels)

#### Art Project:

**20 minutes for culinary led by Doug Rempel**
